The St Barnabas Mothers' Union is organising an outing for everyone, whether a member or not, to Wimbledon Windmill this Saturday (15th July), meeting at the Windmill at 2.00pm. The Windmill is celebrating its bicentenary this year and there is a café there serving tea, cakes and cream teas, etc. The picturesque Queensmere Pond is just 300 yards from the Windmill and will make a pleasant walk also. The windmill is a Key Stage 2 schools' resource and there will be an opportunity to see model windmills and information about milling as well as a film about windmills. One way to get to the Windmill is to take a 154 bus towards Morden at about 12.45pm from the bottom of St Barnabas Road (care: check that the stop is open at weekends); change at St Lawrence Church (that bus stop is now called "South Thames College"), then take a 93 Bus and alight at the Parkside Hospital stop on Wimbledon Common. It is then about a 200-yard signposted walk. Alternatively, there is a free car park at the Windmill. If anyone needs a lift could they please speak to Janice Clarke in church next Sunday, 9th July.
